Advanced Placement Course Expectations, Commitments, and Responsibilities

You are currently registering to enroll and complete an Advanced Placement Course. Advanced Placement Course and Examination completion is a collaborative effort between the student, the teacher, and parents/guardians that requires commitment and perseverance.

The Student agrees to organize time and effort to successfully complete the selected year-long AP course. Students are required to maintain a "C" average in any AP course. Most AP require some type of summer assignment, outside reading, and timely homework completion. Mock or practice exams will be offered one to two times per year; it is the expectation that AP-enrolled students participate in these opportunities. Students are expected to complete the AP Exam for each course they are enrolled in. These exams are at the beginning of May of each school year. **Students enrolled in AP courses MAY NOT drop the course for any reason. AP courses are year-long courses.** As AP courses are college-level, behavior and attitude is expected to be exemplary and in accordance with college-level expectations.

Parents and Guardians agree to be familiar with and accept the AP Course Requirements/Objectives as published by the College Board. Parents and Guardians are requested to provide study time and space in support of AP Course assignments. The parent/guardian agrees to pay for any required materials and Exams (Exams may cost up to \$91.00) unless the enrolled student qualifies for the Free and Reduced Lunch Program, or applies and qualifies for additional hardship grants. Currently, the Weld Re8 School District provides all required textbooks for AP-enrolled students. Summer materials, such as a paperback book, will be student-purchased.

Fort Lupton High School Teachers are committed to providing rigorous and challenging course content in strict accordance with the College Board AP Course objectives and guidelines. AP Teachers also agree to provide enrolled students with extra tutoring or support as needed. AP Teachers also commit to attending summer training opportunities to ensure that students are receiving current AP course material and content.

Advanced Placement GPA Weighting. Students who complete the AP Course Requirements and the College Board Exam with a grade of A, B, or C will have that AP Course grade weighted on a 5.0 scale. Students who elect not to take the College Board Exam, or fail to complete the year-long course, or earn a grade of D or F will not be eligible for the 5.0 scale weighting. In those cases, the student's AP grade will be weighted on the traditional 4.0 scale, and they will be expected to complete an in-class final for a grade to be recorded in the Infinite Campus system.
